

Capital Campaign FAQs

What is a capital campaign?

We ask you to pledge each fall church's stewardship campaign to maintain the church's existing programs and infrastructure, supporting ministries like the Food Pantry, Youth Group, and Worship services. A capital campaign is asking for you to make a promise to donate a specific amount towards a specific item. You might remember a campaign to buy the bus and replace the windows. This is in the same family as those fundraising efforts.

Why Now?

Concord is turning 250 years old next year. The sanctuary has been a central part of the church's life since 1940. It was last remodeled in 1982 and shows those 40 years of life, with needed repairs beyond the scope of what our regular budget can support. We want to set ourselves up for another 250 years of successful ministry with a refreshed sanctuary space.

There's a Covered Dish Lunch on 10/20 following worship, what are you hoping to accomplish?

In order to kick-off the planning process, we want to hear your stories. What have you found meaningful about our sanctuary? What stories do you have to share?

Also, we recognize everyone might have different opinions about what needs to be addressed, so the planning team would like to hear what is important to you and what you believe they need to consider. Always wanted to paint the walls green? Think the aisle needs to be two feet wider? Now is your chance to be heard!

Who is in charge of this campaign?

The initiative began during a session meeting while planning for the Presbytery Meeting in May. The discussion continued over the next several months and it was decided we should take an holistic approach with a wide scope of possibilities.

A Planning team is in the process of being assembled who will guide the initial planning stages and includes construction professionals, project management experience, and few folks with an eye for design. If you would like to serve on this group, please contact a member of Session.

Mid-Week Devotion

On a long hike through an Indiana forest, I stumbled upon a spindly tree that had tumbled off a cliff. Walking in the cool caverns below, I could see how the wind and the rain had eroded the ground under its tangled roots. But the tree did not simply fall. It snapped at the base, and tipped over into the chasm beneath. But, the tree didn't die.

At first, the tree grew straight dow, as it surrending to gravity. After all, there was nowhere to go. But at the point of breaking, the remnant began to thicken. It must have taken years, but its roots grew wider and deeper. Then, in a shocking act of hubris, the tree decided to try growing sideways. It added a few wobbly branches sticking out horizontally. But at the some point, the tree decided sunlight was a good idea, and the only direction to go was up.

Perhaps you know what it's like to be pushed off the edge. The human condition is all thin roots and rocky soil, and so you fall. When your life is snapped at the stem, there is almost nothing to do by watch yourself break. The best we can do is survive. Nothing will feel possible, but there you are. Another day.

Our self-help culture will try to explain to you this is the time to become better than before. After all, this is an opportunity.

The deep evil inherent in the Perfectibility Paradigm is on full display. Your humanity is now a liability. Please hear me say - you are not a loser, just lost. And God is with you. This is God's magic act. The more we suffer, the more we can't get away from God.


